Pediatric occupational therapy focuses on assisting children to develop the skills they need to be independent and functional in their daily activities such as play, school, and self-care tasks. Our pediatric occupational therapists are patient and family-focused to determine the child's strengths, areas for improvement, and overall child/ family goals. Lynda and Bailie work with children of various diagnoses/disabilities or after an injury or accident to maximize their function and quality of life. They can provide treatment for:

- Sensory Processing Disorders
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- ADD/ADHD
- Genetic Conditions
- Neurological conditions such as Cerebral Palsy
- Developmental Delay
- Fine Motor Coordination Delays
- Learning Delays
- Traumatic Brain and/or Spinal Cord Injuries
- Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis
- General Orthopedic Injuries and Surgeries
